iStatement Suggestions

How To Prepare Students

- Explore Careers
 - Try using <u>www.careercruising.com</u>
 - Your school will need to purchase a license to this site
- Explore Morals and Values
 - Use "What are your values?" worksheet
- Practice writing statements
 - Use "My own uniqueness" worksheet
 - Have students create an acrostic
 - Use the "Who am I?" rubric for a short PowerPoint

Time Management

- Locating Pictures on the Internet
 - Seta time limit for the number of days students have to find pictures
 - Set a limit for how many they should have at the end of each day
 - If you are on block schedule, allow 3 but no more than 4 days
 - If you are on 50 minute periods, I would give them 1 week
 - Creating the iStatement
 - Give students a time limit on the length of their finished iStatement video
 - Recommend 1:45 but no more than 3 minutes.

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Pictures

- Find pictures on the Internet
 - Remind students inappropriate pictures may come up but ignore it like a responsible adult
 - Some students may still display immaturity
 - Give them guidance to help keep them on track
 - Suggested websites: www.flickr.com, www.photobucket.com, http://schools.clipart.com
- Advise students to bring pictures from home
 - Helps to tell the story about the student and who they really are
 - Pictures can be digital or can be scanned into the computer

Music

- Choosing appropriate music that follows school guidelines
 - Have students print out the lyrics to their songs so you may approve them
 - Pick a songs that describe them or has special meaning in their lives
 - Songs need to be on a CD or flashdrive
 - Can't pull music off of an mp3 player. The format doesn't allow for trasnfer.
