Causes of Hypoglycemia	Onset of Hypoglycemia
Too much insulin	Sudden – symptoms may progress rapidly
Missing or delaying meals or snacks

Getting extra, intense, or unplanned physical activity	
Being ill, particularly with gastrointestinal illness

Actions for Treating Hypoglycemia			
If possible, assist client to check blood glucose (sugar).			
Treat for hypoglycemia if blood glucose level is less thanmg/dL.
